High Schools take an End of Courses (EOC) exam in 8 subject areas (9th Grade Literature, American Literature, Algebra, Geometry, Biology, Physical Science, US History, and Economics). Results from the EOC are Level 1 (Beginning Learner), Level 2 (Developing Learner), Level 3 (Proficient Learner), and Level 4 (Distinguished Learner).
